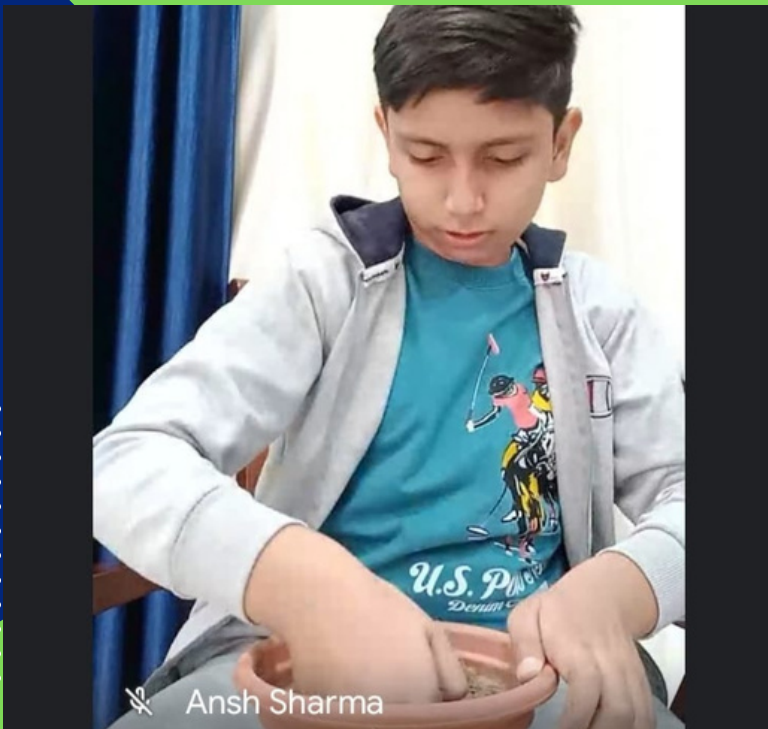
The guests from C.B.S.E. were highly impressed by our vast infrastructure and facilities at **Brookfield International School.**
