GERMINATION ACTIVITY

**A LITTLE SEED FOR ME TO SOW, A LITTLE SOIL TO MAKE IT GROW
A LITTLE HOLE, A LITTLE PAT, A LITTLE WISH, AND THAT IS THAT
A LITTLE SUN, A LITTLE SHOWER, A LITTLE WHILE AND THEN A FLOWER !!**

Germination is a great way to introduce life cycles and show kids how flowers and some of our fruits and vegetables can grow. It is a good STEM activity for kindergarten children. For BFIS kids to become master gardeners in their lifetime we had a germination activity on **5th JULY** at school. This hands-on activity not only makes them understand a plant's cycle but also allows them to closely monitor and see the magical changes a seed goes through when given water and sunshine.

Conducting experiments with kids helps them to become more observant about the world around them. It also encourages higher-order thinking and asking questions. By observing and taking note of changes, children build upon their vocabulary to note colours, sizes, shapes, textures and smells. In experiments, children problem-solve by brainstorming and trying different things like; Why did my plant not grow? Maybe I added too much water. Starting as seeds and ending with bean plants shows the process the seeds in the soil go through. From dry beans to green beans, children can see where some of our food comes from.

GREEN DAY CELEBRATION

BFIS kids and teachers came in beautiful shades of green attire on **07th July** to celebrate green day. These cute little ones helped us decorate the environment with green things and cute green veggie n fruit cutouts. They went around the school campus for a nature walk. Children prepared some art and crafts using green leaves "**GREEN**"- a colour of calmness and relaxation that also provides a sense of vitality and renewal. The main objective of celebrating this day is to create awareness about the earth and to cherish the Greenery we are blessed with. This is one of the most important social responsibilities that every individual should be aware of.

PAPER BAG DECORATION

Paper Bag Day is celebrated annually on **July 12** to raise awareness amongst people about the pollution caused by the use of plastic carry bags. And this day also encourages us to use only paper bags as it's highly environment friendly. Paper bags are made out of renewable materials and these are biodegradable and recyclable. Tiny tots of **BFIS** decorated paper bags creatively with finger painting, stickers and ribbons to spread this message that we should use paper bags and say no to plastic. ENGLISH RECITATION COMPETITION

Poetry Recitation allows children to become familiar with the nuances of a language, including sentence patterns and parts of speech, thus deepening their understanding of the language. In fact, studies show that incorporating singing into language lessons improves vocabulary recognition, particularly for elementary students. With listening skills peaking between ages 3-6, young students must be immersed in an environment that promotes audible expression as a core part of the curriculum. On **24th July**, our kindergarten children participated in the English Recitation Competition held at school. Children were judged on the basis of clarity of speech, pronunciation, content and presentation.

For kindergarten children, playing with sounds and rhyming patterns in poetry supports the development of the vocal apparatus in the mouth, pharynx and nose, helping speech and language development. Children reciting rhythmic poetry learn and understand pitch, voice inflexion, and volume. Reciting poetry helps emphasise the sound and the rhythm of language, thus building a child's phonemic awareness and helping to solidify a foundation for reading abilities. Children also learn to pick up patterns and sequences in poetry recitations. As they practice memorizing the poetry to recite, it links memory with audio and visual events, helping them develop memorization skills. Being proficient in memorization, patterns, and sequences, in turn, give students an advantage in learning new languages, reading comprehension and mathematics. Poetry recitation is a form of self-expression with the creativity of words and emotions to convey a message to the audience.
